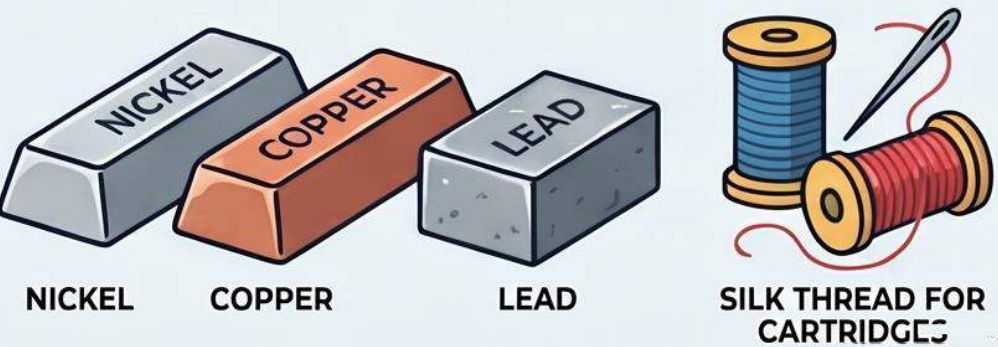
EXAMPLES OF RESTRICTED INDUSTRIAL MATERIALS

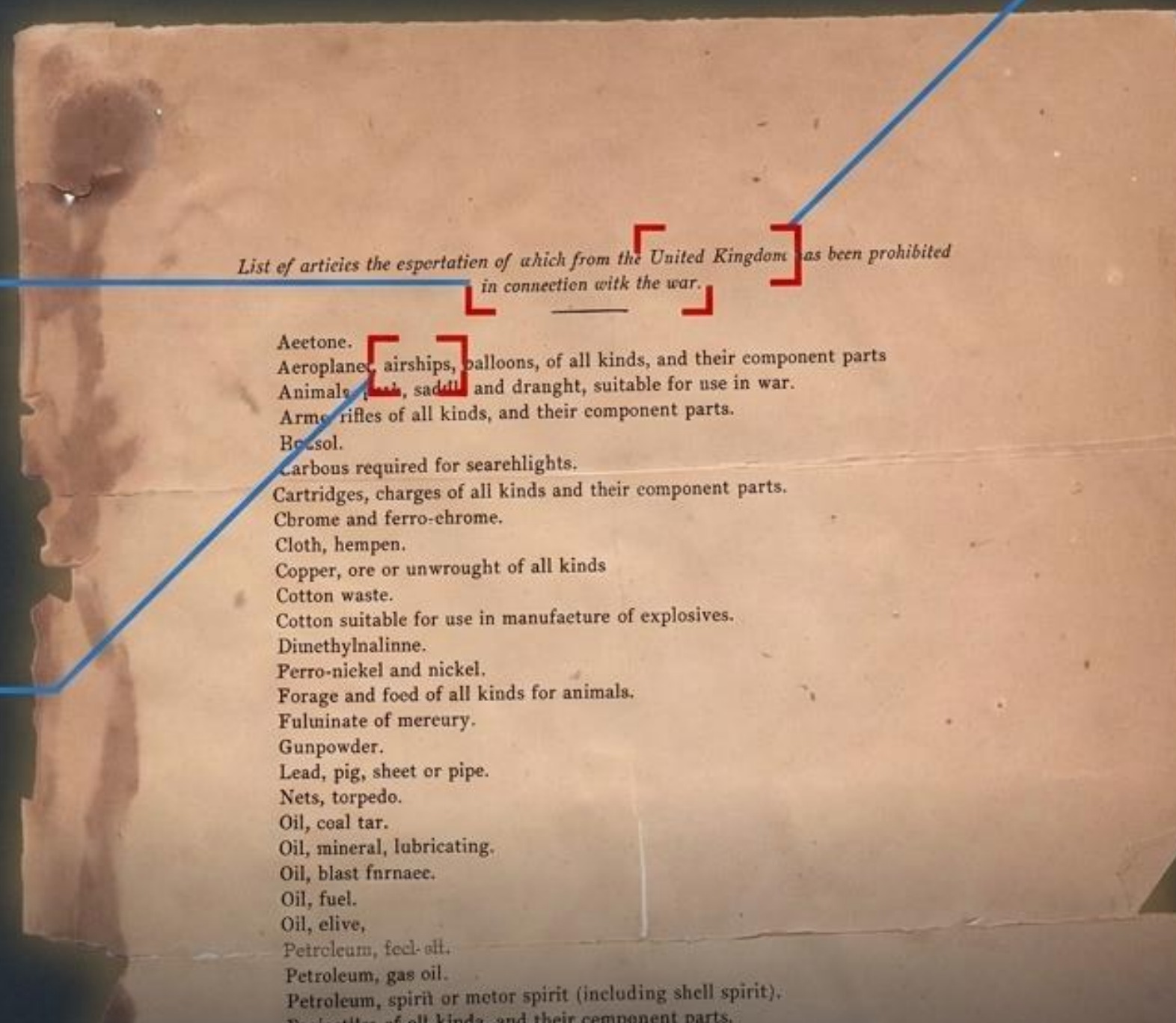


An alphabetical list hides the blueprint for a total war economy.

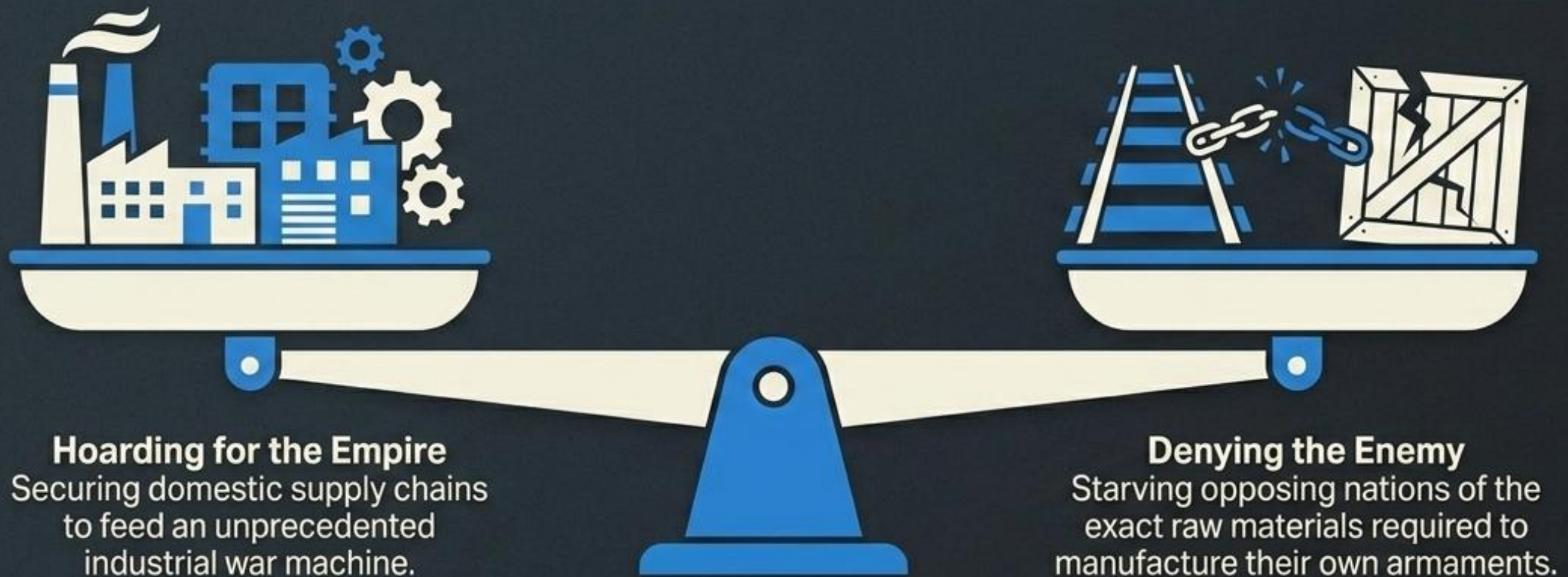
The Origin: Issued by the British Government.

The Context: A state of total, existential conflict requiring the restriction of trade.

The Clue: The specific inclusion of airships alongside aeroplanes firmly dates this embargo to the World War I era.



The strategy shifted from battlefield tactics to supply chain attrition.



Every raw material became a weapon. A ban on export was simultaneously an act of economic defence and offence.

Sorting the contraband reveals four pillars of the industrial war machine.

The vital solvent required to manufacture **Cordite** (smokeless powder).

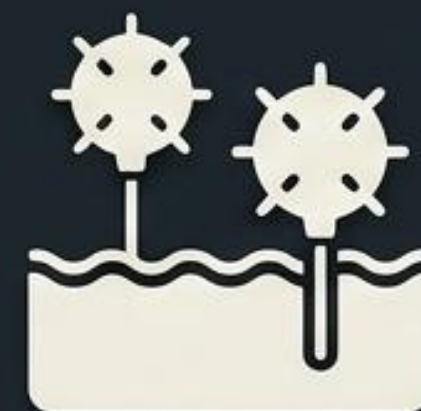
Toluol

Harmless domestic commodities conceal critical wartime applications.

Item	Civilian Use	Concealed Wartime Value
Cotton waste Cotton suitable for use in manufacture of explosives	Discarded textile scraps	Essential base material for nitrocellulose (Guncotton).
Silk thread suitable for cartridges Silk cloth	Luxury fashion garments	Artillery propellant bags (silk leaves no burning residue to foul the gun barrel).
Oil, olive	Culinary preparation	Glycerine extraction for explosives and precision machine lubrication.

The sheer volume of fuels marks the dawn of mechanised warfare.

The transition from coal-powered steam to internal combustion engines.

- **'Petroleum, spirit or motor spirit (including shell spirit)'**: Required for the brand-new fleets of supply lorries and aeroplanes.
- **'Petroleum, fuel oil' & 'Oil, blast furnace'**: Essential for firing the boilers of the new generation of naval dreadnoughts.

The logistics of the era straddled two completely different centuries.

The Ancient Paradigm

Animals, pack, saddle and draught, suitable for use in war.

Forage and food of all kinds for animals.

Millions of horses and mules remained the primary engine for moving artillery and supplies through the mud.

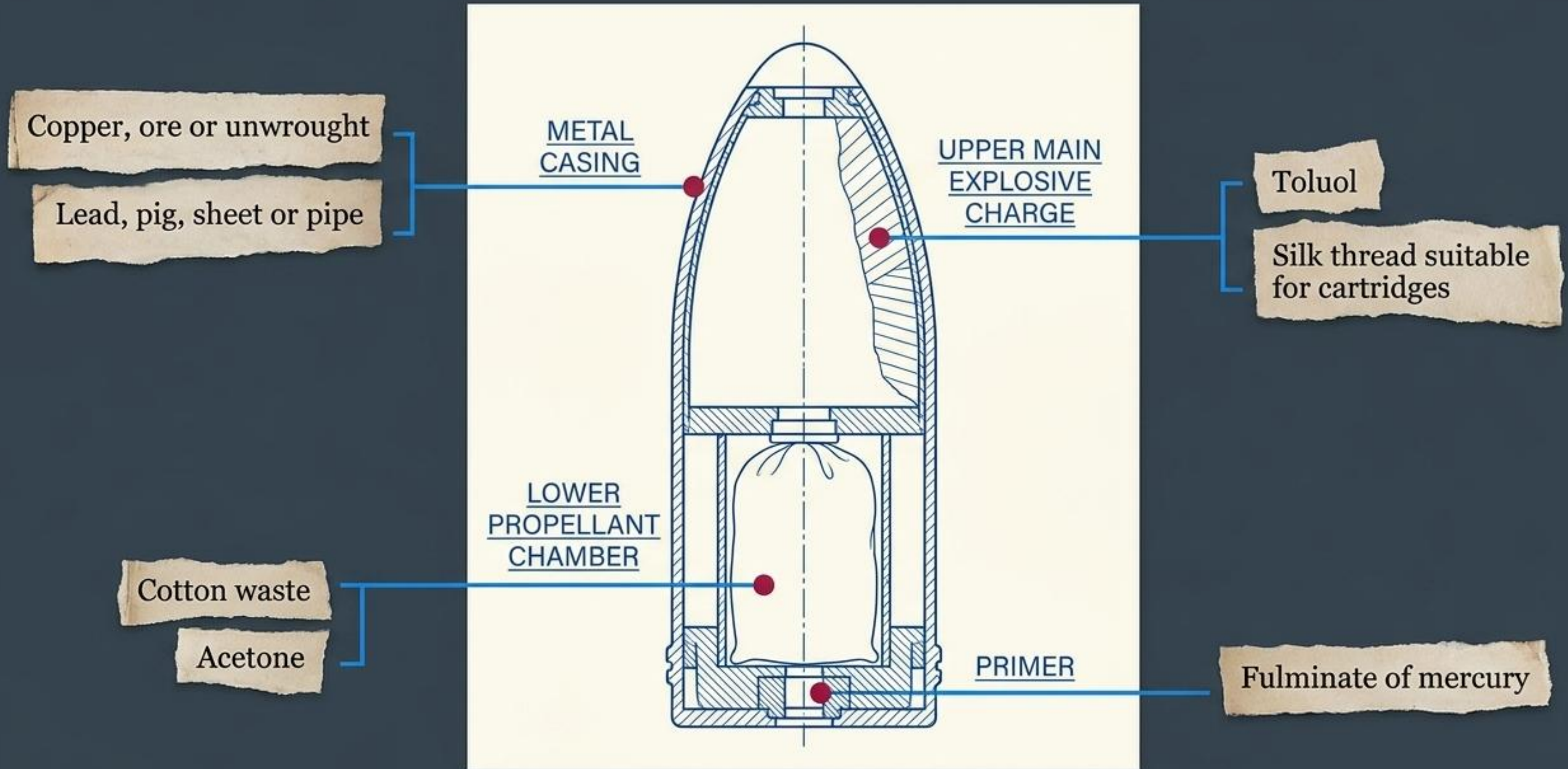
The Modern Paradigm

Aeroplanes, airships, balloons, of all kinds, and their component parts.

Carbons required for searchlights.

Simultaneously, cutting-edge aviation and electric searchlights were transforming the skies into a new theatre of operations.
